




Fall Color Special on The Cumbres & Toltec





This fall marked the first time that Galloping Goose No. 5 has been operated in the fall since it was still in operation on the Rio Grande Southern Railroad in the fall of 1951! It was our privilege to put her back on the rails in a fall setting – the Cumbres & Toltec – that is very similar to RGS country. The pictures on this page, in black & white, don't do justice to the magnificent scenery!

We ran four days of revenue trips and each day was a through trip from either Chama to Antonito or Antonito to Chama. Every trip was a sell-out which points to the fact that rail fans never seem to tire of mountain railroading no matter what the season!

The picture above left is typical of the many sections along the way where golden aspen trees lined the right-of-way. Above right was a "static photo shoot" of the Goose overlooking the Los Pinos River valley several hundred feet below.

Railfest on the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad


For the 12th year in a row the Galloping Goose Historical Society has attended Railfest on the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad with the restored RGS Galloping Goose No. 5.

This year the D&S scheduled Railfest in mid-August instead of toward the end of the month in the hope of attracting more families – since more and more schools begin classes in the latter half of August. From our standpoint the change was a benefit because our ridership was up about 20% and there seemed to be more families riding with us.

There was another factor that contributed to the increase in overall passenger numbers and that was the appearance of the Eureka & Palisades Engine No. 4 which returned to Railfest for the first time in three years. E&P No. 4 is owned and operated by Mr. Dan Markoff of Las Vegas, Nevada.

It was truly fun for us to be able to run with them again and we think our passengers (and theirs) got a lot of great pictures and memories from "chasing" them!
