#### Mothers Day at the CRRM





For the first time, Galloping Goose #5 left her home territory in southwestern Colorado for a trip to the Denver area. The occasion was the 1<sup>st</sup> annual "Goosefest" at the Colorado Railroad Museum in Golden over the Mothers Day weekend. On May 7<sup>th</sup> #5 was transported to Golden on a truck donated by Skanska Construction Company of Cortez, Colorado. Test runs were conducted on Friday with the official operating runs taking place on Saturday and Sunday. Included in the event were motors 2, 6 and 7 which reside at the CRRM and the replica of #1 from Ridgway. The picture above right shows the flock gathered together in front of the CRRM roundhouse – in order left to right: numbers 1, 5, 7, 6 and 2. (Ignore the "modern" diesel on the far right.) The museum has a one-half mile loop of narrow gauge track. Above left shows #5 on the loop at the main entrance gate. We ran all 6 motors on the loop every half hour on Saturday and Sunday. Many of the museum visitors rode at least once on each of the 3 "big" Geese (2, 5, &7). We totaled over 700 passengers in all on #5 over the two days. Plans are in the works for next year – hopefully including numbers 3, from Knott's Berry Farm, and 4 which is currently being restored at the Ridgway Railroad Museum.



## June on the Cumbres & Toltec


