### Finances—Crunch Time for the Society

Like other businesses and attractions in the Four Corners area, the GGHS continues to experience a shortfall in visitation and funding. In addition, the 2014 excursion calendar did not include a July run on the Cumbres and Toltec, resulting in a loss of profit of \$3,500.

Merchandise sales and member contributions make up 70% of the Society's operating income while 30% comes from excursions. The 2011 summer season saw a \$3,000 dip in shop sales compared to 2010; 2012 sales were down slightly, but fell off dramatically in 2013 by nearly \$5,000. Sales in 2014 are keeping pace with 2013.

To address this issue, the

Board continues to monitor expenses closely. Expenses for 2013 ran just under \$20,000 and expenses for 2014 continue to be about the same. As a point of interest. insurance payments for the Society total \$7,700 annually, or nearly 40% of operating costs. In addition to minimizing expenses, the Board is seeking additional grants and outside sponsorships, developing a marketing campaign that will attract new visitors, and

training new crew in order to run three complete excursions in 2015.

What can you do? First <u>please</u> renew your membership. Second, encourage friends and neighbors to visit the

museum. Third, attend the Annual Business Meeting Barbecue/Potluck on Saturday, Sept. 13<sup>th</sup>. (See article) In addition, if each member could include an extra \$5 or \$10 with your dues renewal it would make such a difference to the Society this year.

We appreciate all you do for your Society and we are working hard to turn things around in 2015.

### Update on Coach 256 ~ Comments are welcomed

In 1999 RGS Coach 256 was purchased by the GGHS. At that time, the Society's plan was to restore the Coach back to its original configuration for static display and place the coach in a location near the GGHS depot as an adjunct to the

museum.

For the last 12 years GGHS boards have taken up the project for discussion at various times especially when preservation maintenance was done, and when the Coach was relocated to Val Truelson's property for

organizations, the GGHS is in need of volunteers, and so a lack of enough persons to take on the project has been the principal road block to restoration which begins with writing for grants and

forming a comprehensive work plan.

Last winter The Board of Directors formed Coach #256 committee which is taking up the work of formulating the necessary steps to restore the coach to a condition suitable for static display which is estimated to exceed \$50,000. Or alternatively, to make recommendations in the event restoration does not begin in a reasonable length

of time. The number one goal of the Board is to see the Coach preserved long into the future. After all, Coach #256 is now 134 years old.
